

# Planning 10 - Course Outline

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Planning 10 is focused on student-centered learning and inquiry. Students will work to meet the following learning outcome areas of this course:

- Education and Careers
- Graduation Program
- Finances
- Health

Most assignments have general expectations but the flexibility for students to work through them based their own post-secondary plans.

Our primary learning will take place in an online environment where students can find all the assignments and other tools that will be used to help demonstrate understanding of the learning outcomes. Students need active accounts on [www.edmodo.com](http://www.edmodo.com) and [www.myblueprint.ca](http://www.myblueprint.ca) in order to complete assignments. Course ID's and Keys required to create accounts are given out in September. If students are having technical difficulties completing the assignments, as most will be completed electronically, it is their responsibility to discuss this with me well in advance of the end of term.

The course is designed to allow for flexibility along with an opportunity to be successful. Many students find that being an independent and autonomous learner is difficult and takes dedication. We will spend 2-4 classes per term in a lab setting but students need to be certain they are working independently as well in order to complete the assignments. While some students find this format initially challenging, it is intended to better prepared for future elements of learning and working in online settings.

## Assessment

Students have approximately 20 assignments that need to be completed by the end of the year. All assignments are posted online through [www.edmodo.com](http://www.edmodo.com) and are completed electronically or through [www.myblueprint.ca](http://www.myblueprint.ca). Once assignments are completed, please be sure to follow each assignment's "Submission Instructions" so that I know you're done and can assess your submission.

All assignments are all graded out of 2.

- 2.0 Assignment meets expectations
- 1.5 Missing one or two small elements that require attention
- 1.0 Assignment is missing one or more major elements that require attention
- 0.5 Assignment has been received but meets few if any expectations
- 0.0 Assignment has not been submitted

As this course is taught in conjunction with Band 10, the calendar will adjust through the year depending on the Band 10 schedule, but students should expect to complete 4-6 assignments per term.
